Important Points of Information

The School Day

School starts at 9.10am and finishes at 2:50pm (1:50pm for Junior/Senior Infants). For insurance purposes, children are not admitted into the building until school begins as they are not supervised by teachers. The Board of Management does not accept any responsibility for children before 9.10am and after 1:50pm for infants and 2:50pm for all other classes. Children will enter the school in the morning via the side doors on the yard and must be collected from the yard at home-time. Parents must notify the school in writing if there is any change in arrangements for children going home.

Pupil Absences

A written note must be furnished in the event of your child being absent for any reason. This note can be written in your child's homework journal (appropriate pages in the middle) or put in a note to the teacher. Parents are reminded that under the provisions of the Education Welfare Act (2000), principals of all schools are obliged by law to inform the authorities in the case of any pupil who misses 20 or more days during the school year, for any reason. Missing time from school is a significant factor in educational performance. Pupils, however, should not be in school if they are unwell.

Parent-Teacher Communication

If you wish to meet your child's teacher, you are asked to make an appointment. An appointment system ensures that teaching is not interrupted and that classes are not left unsupervised. Day-to-day communication with the teacher can be made through the school journal. Formal parent-teacher meetings will be held in November.

Medicines

Please notify us if your child has any allergies or medical condition that you feel we should know about. Staff do not give medicines to pupils. Pupils are not permitted to have or use medicines on the school premises unless the school has been informed of this in writing. Any parent who feels that their child needs medication in case of emergency should contact the principal to discuss procedure. As we apply plasters for minor cuts and grazes, please inform us if you do not want us to do this for your child for any reason e.g. child allergic to plasters etc.

Contact Information

Please notify Anna, the school secretary, of any changes in contact numbers, addresses etc. so that our database can be kept up to date. It is important to have a backup system in place in the event of your child becoming unwell during school.

Pupil Personal Accident Insurance Scheme

Every year parents are offered the opportunity to avail of the Pupil Personal Accident Insurance Scheme. While participating in this scheme is **not obligatory**, it is recommended that parents of children participating in school sporting activities/competitions would consider availing of this scheme. All children are currently covered by the school's insurance policy but claims will only be paid out on, if negligence can be proved. Further details are available from the school office.

No Party Invitations
